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Corporate Policy 1080: Conflict Minerals

This Corporate Policy emphasizes the priority to source minerals responsibly within the GF Corporation and its supply chain.

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General

The Georg Fischer (GF) Corporate Policy 1080 on Conflict Minerals is the foundation on which the Corporation base its raw material sourcing activities. This policy applies to all companies, which are a part of the worldwide group of GF.

GF complies with legal requirements in the jurisdictions where it operates in addition to Corporation-specific regulations, standards and the Code for Business Partners.

1. Management systems for conflict minerals

GF is committed to sourcing its materials responsibly. GF makes every effort to ensure that its products do not contain minerals (e.g. tin, tungsten, tantalum, gold, and cobalt) sourced from mines from conflict-affected and high-risk areas.

Consequently, GF identifies products, which potentially contain conflict minerals, and has a respective management system in place. GF

GF

- does not directly purchase conflict minerals as identified by the United States Securities and Exchange Commission;
- expects from its suppliers to take appropriate due diligence measures to determine the origins of minerals used in their supply chain and ensure they do not originate from conflict and high-risk areas. GF assesses the risks of relevant suppliers based on the criteria of the Responsible Minerals Initiative (RMI) and has a corrective action management plan in place;
- reports on the content of conflict minerals in its products and is dedicated to reducing their amount used for its products and within its supply chain. The annual reporting is in accordance with the EU directive (Regulation 2017/821) and the Dodd-Frank Act;
- provides information to its customers when requested or when legally required too and
- traces conflict minerals back to smelter or refiner level, as a minimum, in accordance with the RMI.
